S. SMITH: Homer's Iliad and Odyssey in Hyginus' Fabulae

Hyginus' Fabulae is a complicated text that presents mythical data in a unique way among ancient mythographical texts. Among the most debated aspect is the use of sources; this essay both examines the ways in which Hyginus engages with and rewrites the data from Homer's Iliad and Odyssey and presents a close look at the presentation of the new matrix in which Hyginus' readers encountered "Homer," one in which the Iliad's data—entangled with later Homeric exegesis and reception—is integrated into the fabric of the whole Trojan War and the Odyssey is recast into a flatter, chronological order.
